## **Gathering Together**

Dastor's November is a time of gathering together: at our polling locations, for a Thanksgiving meal, even in

Black Friday lines. It sounds like a time of excitement and celebration. But for many of us, the reality of gathering together is more likely a time of heated debates about political affiliations, strained relationships with relatives, and hostile crowds trying to get a head start on Christmas shopping. When Jesus commands His disciples, and us, to "love our neighbors", it's important to remember that He <u>doesn't</u> command us to "convince" our neighbors to change their political views... to "like" those family members that we find annoying at Thanksgiving... or to "control" a hostile crowd gathered outside of WalMart on Black Friday.

Instead, Jesus commands us to <u>love</u> our neighbors. But how? St. Paul reminds us, "God shows His love for us in that <u>while we were yet sinners</u> Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8). And in the same way, Jesus calls us to show that same kind of sacrificial love, humility, and grace to all of our neighbors, even those we consider our "enemies". Could that love be shown in listening, rather than arguing a point? Or including someone that we'd rather ignore? Or showing courtesy, kindness and generosity in a place that's fraught with everything to the contrary? That's the kind of love Jesus gave on the cross... for you... for me... and for all of us. # **Church Council Highlights**

#### St. Matthias Lutheran Church Council Minutes - 9/12/2022

The September 2022 Council meeting was held via a Zoom Conference call. Voting Council members Fred Oestreicher, Bob Wolff, Lisa Pegg, and Pastor Paul were in attendance. Ryan Winslow and Norb Georges were unable to attend. Our Treasurer, Eldora Crist, was unable to attend. Our Financial Secretary, Eliot Moore, was able to attend. Council President Fred Oestreicher led the devotions at 8:01pm. Council President Fred Oestreicher called the meeting to Order at 8:05pm. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the Council agenda, as presented. Motion seconded by Bob Wolff. Motion carried. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the August 8 Council meeting, as presented. Motion seconded by Lisa Pegg. Motion carried. Eliot Moore, Financial Secretary, presented the August Treasurer's report. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the August Treasurer's report. Motion seconded by Bob Wolff. Motion carried. Pastor Paul presented his report for <u>August</u>. He attended the monthly Synod meeting for Pastors and Deacons. He also attended meetings for the Synod Resource Center Advisory Board and for the Synod Assembly Planning Committee. He made home visits with Chuck and Nancy Kemerer and a nursing home visit with Lillian Reno. Pastor Paul continues to serve as Interim Pastor at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Greensburg for approximately 5 hours per week.

<u>Communications</u>: Kim Peles from Stamp Camp requested to modify their meeting dates for November and December as follows: November 14 and 18, and December 5. No scheduling conflicts were identified with these dates. <u>Concerns</u>: None

#### Committee Reports were presented

#### Old Business:

1. Church Safety Policies and Procedures - No updates needed at this time.

2. <u>Church Website</u> - Our church secretary, Amy Repak, is preparing the new website, which will be launched by early October.

#### New Business:

1. 2023 Proposed Budget presented at October Council meeting

Our Finance Committee will meet in September to prepare the 2023 proposed budget, which will be presented to Council at our meeting on October 10.

2. Annual Meeting, Part 1, Nov. 20th – Agenda and Council Elections

(see Agenda handout)

The Agenda was reviewed. Fred Oestreicher and Bob Wolff are finishing their first term on Council at the end of 2022, and were asked to consider serving a second term. Both Fred and Bob agreed to do so. Council was also asked to consider candidates for this year's Council elections. We can still add up to 3 additional Council members.

3. Set Date for Annual Meeting, Part 2, in January

Due to the time needed to prepare the financial documents in the Annual Report, Council generally likes to schedule the annual meeting in the later part of January. Bob Wolff made a motion to set the date for the Annual Congregational Meeting, Part 2, for Sunday, January 22, 2023. Motion seconded by Fred Oestreicher. Motion carried. New Business item 7 will address another factor in setting the date for this meeting. 4. Mileage Reimbursement

In the process of purchasing the drum set for St. Matthias, our Organist and Choir Director, Chuck Vita, travelled 53 miles. Because the mileage was beyond what is normally required of his position, Chuck has requested to be receive mileage reimbursement for this task. The current IRS mileage reimbursement rate is 0.625 cents per mile, which would equate to a reimbursement of \$33.13. Bob Wolff made a motion to reimburse Chuck Vita for the mileage incurred (53 miles) during the purchase of the drum set, for a total of \$33.13. For future mileage reimbursements, prior authorization from Council will be required. Motion seconded by Fred Oestreicher. Motion carried. Our Treasurer, Eldora Crist, will be asked to write this reimbursement check for Chuck, to be taken from the Memorial Fund regarding Music Supplies. 5. Requested CPR Class Dates

Council reviewed and approved the dates requested by Nations' Best CPR in November and December for their CPR classes.

#### 6. Online Giving/Donations for the Website

As our church secretary, Amy Repak, is preparing the new website, she would like to ask Council if they would like to include a function for those visiting the website (which includes members of the congregation) to be able to make online donations to St. Matthias. This function could include options to give toward the operating budget as well as any other areas desired (for example, Teddy Bear Fund, Food 2 Go 4 Kids, etc.). The donor can usually make the contribution via their credit card, debit card, or bank account. If Council is interested in learning more specifics, Amy can contact the Synod office to learn more about what other ELCA congregations in our Synod are using as a vendor, and the specifics involved. Council's consensus was to have Amy gather the information for Council to review.

7. Bylaws for Annual Meeting Dates

(see Bylaws handout) In our Congregational Constitution, the annual congregational meetings are to be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays in November and January. While this is generally a good time for those meetings, sometimes this presents a difficulty in having the materials ready on time. For example, January 1, 2023, is a Sunday, which would normally restrict our meeting dates to either January 8 or 15, 2023. This makes it difficult to have the annual report prepared on time for the Annual Meeting, Part 2 in January. With that in mind, we'd like to consider <u>modifying the Bylaws</u> in our Congregational Constitution (which would require a congregational vote at one of our annual congregational meetings) to read as follows: "The semi-annual Congregation meetings shall be held as follows: the first session in the month of November, and the second session in the month of January." This would allow the Church Council greater flexibility in scheduling these meetings, while still maintaining the spirit of the timeliness of those sessions. Bob Wolff made a motion to update the Bylaws of the Congregational Constitution, as indicated above. Motion seconded by Fred Oestreicher. Motion carried. A copy of this update, along with a description of why the change is being requested, will be sent via email and hardcopy to the congregational members, along with the 2023 proposed budget, after the October Council meeting.

\*\* End of New Business \*\*

The <u>October</u> Worship Assistants and Calendar were reviewed. No updates were needed. The next monthly Council meeting will be on <u>Monday, October 10, at 7pm</u>. We'll meet via Zoom call again.

Ryan Winslow will lead devotions for the October Council meeting.

Fred Oestreicher made a motion to adjourn the meeting.

Motion seconded by Bob Wolff.

Motion carried.

#### St. Matthias Lutheran Church Council Minutes – 10/10/2022

The October 2022 Council meeting was held via a Zoom Conference call. Voting Council members Fred Oestreicher, Bob Wolff, Lisa Pegg, Ryan Winslow, Norb Georges, and Pastor Paul were in attendance. Our Treasurer, Eldora Crist, was able to attend. Our Financial Secretary, Eliot Moore, was able to attend. Ryan Winslow led the devotions at 7:03pm. Council President Fred Oestreicher called the meeting to Order at 7:08pm. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the Council agenda, as presented. Motion seconded by Lisa Pegg. Motion carried. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the minutes from the September 12 Council meeting, as presented. Motion seconded by Bob Wolff. Motion carried. Treasurer, Eldora Crist, presented the September Treasurer's report. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the September Treasurer's report. Motion seconded by Ryan Winslow. Motion carried. Pastor Paul presented his report for September. He attended the monthly Synod meeting for Pastors and Deacons, as well as a ministerial meeting led by the Director of the National Catholic Center for Holocaust Education at Seton Hill about building our communities through good neighboring. He also attended our Al-Anon group's anniversary luncheon. He made a home visit with Vicki and Norb Georges, and met with new members Terry and Lova Yeargers to introduce them to St. Matthias. Pastor Paul continues to serve as Interim Pastor at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Greensburg for approximately 5 hours per week.

The Agenda was reviewed. We can still add up to 3 additional Council members in this year's Council elections. Line items will be added to approve the date of our Annual Meeting, Part 2, and to approve the update to our constitutional bylaws to add more flexibility in the dates for our annual meetings.

#### 2. Pastor Health Benefit Selection

Each year, the congregation is asked to choose a health insurance election for Pastor Paul.

This is the 10<sup>th</sup> year where the congregation needs to make an election of coverage.

This year, that election needs to be affirmed online on Portico's website during the month of October. Pastor Paul with then affirm this election online in November. The Gold Plus option matches what the congregation has offered Pastor Paul each year, and is the recommendation from our Synod. Pastor Paul and our Finance Committee recommend using the Gold Plus option. This will include coverage for Pastor Paul and his daughter Lindsay. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to continue with the Gold Plus option for Pastor Paul's health insurance election, which will include coverage for Pastor Paul and his daughter Lindsay. Motion seconded by Norb Georges. Motion carried.

#### 3. 2022 Annual Reports

Annual Reports need completed for each of our committees for the Annual meeting, Part 2 on January 22, 2023. With the exception of a few reports which are time sensitive (Finance report), we'd like to have the reports completed in electronic form and submitted by December 15<sup>th</sup>.

4. 2023 Proposed Budget
