Happy New Year! Dastor's Remember the song "The 12 Days of Christmas"? The actual 12 days of Christmas begins on December 25,

and goes through January 5. With that in mind, each year, we celebrate the Day of (and begin the season of) Epiphany on January 6.

"Épiphany" represents 2 gifts that God has given us. The <u>first</u> is that <u>God Himself comes to us in the flesh</u>, as Jesus, a baby in a manger. The <u>second</u> is that God gives us <u>the realization</u> that Jesus is God Himself, which often results in a personal feeling of elation, awe, or wonder.

I hope that when you were a child, you had the joy of opening gifts on Christmas morning. If you did, do you remember wanting, and then receiving, a <u>specific</u> gift? At first, the gift was wrapped and placed under the tree, and you didn't know what it was... that was like the <u>first</u> gift of Epiphany. The gift was there, but you didn't realize what it was. But when you opened that gift, and you realized what it was... (hopefully) you were filled with elation, awe, and wonder... that was like the <u>second</u> gift of Epiphany.

<u>Both</u> gifts are important, but the first is required <u>before</u> the second can happen.

God Himself came to us in the flesh as Jesus. And Jesus lived, died, rose from the dead, and ascended back into heaven... for us, and for our salvation. That's what God has done for us.

The question is... do we <u>realize</u> what this gift means? Do we actually <u>open</u> the gift (to receive the <u>second</u> gift of realizing who Jesus really is), or do we leave it unwrapped, lying under the Christmas tree? At first, we might think... "of course I <u>know</u> that Jesus is Emmanuel... God with us". But oftentimes, it seems like we just "go through the motions", and lose our sense of elation, awe, and wonder. And without that "Epiphany", God becomes more of an idea in our heads, rather than a real, present, living God who we can pray to, rely on, and receive in Holy Communion. And if that's the case, we miss out on the joy of the gift of God Himself.

I have to admit, there's times that God feels like an idea in my head, rather than a real, living God who is active in my life. It's at those moments, that I return to God in prayer, and ask Him to give me the <u>second</u> gift again... the gift of realization, the gift of faith... so that I can live in the joy and courage that only God can give us. And I can also then <u>share</u> that same gift with others who may be struggling as well.

Let's remember that faith isn't a merit badge we earn, or an unwavering quality that's never challenged. All of the stress, struggles, and difficulties of life challenge us every day to rely on a God whom we cannot see. But God doesn't leave us alone in that struggle. God came to us in the flesh, and God continues to give us, over and over again, the gift of faith as well. And that's where we place our trust... in God, and not in ourselves. Thanks be to God!

Marked By Love

Through the centuries [people] have displayed many different symbols to show that they are Christians. They have worn crosses in the lapels of their coats, hung chains

about their necks, even had special haircuts. Of course, there is nothing intrinsically wrong with any of this, if one feels it is [one's] calling. But there is a much better sign, a universal mark that is to last through all the ages of the church until Jesus comes back. ...

Love — and the unity it attests to — is the mark Christ gave Christians to wear before the world. Only with this mark may the world know that Christians are indeed Christians and that Jesus was sent by the Father.

Lenten Signals

Why should we observe Lent? This 40-day season of repentance and reflection that begins on Ash Wednesday has three important purposes. Lent helps us STOP, LOOK and LISTEN.

We observe Lent because it tells us to STOP and rest awhile — and to stop sinning. Lent tells us to LOOK inward for an honest self-



examination, to look upward to see the cross of Jesus with healing and love, and to look forward to the hope of the Resurrection. And we observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN to the voice of God, the words of Christ and the movement of the Holy Spirit.

STOP, LOOK and LISTEN! These commands that are so crucial for travel safety are also important for our journey through Lent.

Council President Fred Oestreicher called the meeting to Order at 7:03pm. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the Council agenda, as presented. Motion seconded by Norb Georges. Motion carried. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the minutes from the October 10 Council meeting, as presented. Motion seconded by Lisa Pegg. Motion carried. Treasurer, Eldora Crist, presented the October Treasurer's report. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the October Treasurer's report. Motion seconded by Bob Wolff. Motion carried. Pastor Paul presented his report for **October**. He attended the monthly Synod meeting for Pastors and Deacons, as well as a Synod Consultation Committee meeting, a Synod Assembly Planning Committee meeting, and Synod led boundaries workshop. He made a hospital visit with Jean Kauffman, and presided at the renewal of marriage vows for Emily and Dan Kirkpatrick at the Heinz History Center in Pittsburgh. At the request of parishioners, he's also led counseling and mentoring sessions this past month. Pastor Paul continues to serve as Interim Pastor at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Greensburg for approximately 5 hours per week.

Pastor Paul presented his report for November. He attended the monthly Synod meeting for Pastors and Deacons, as well as a Synod Consultation Committee meeting, and a Synod Assembly Planning Committee meeting. He presided at a funeral for a non-member. He made a hospital visit with Arlene Wohlin, and nursing home visits with Virginia Turner, Norma Bennett, Jean Kauffman, and Lillian Reno. He also led 3 counseling sessions. Pastor Paul continues to serve as Interim Pastor at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Greensburg for approximately 5 hours per week.

New Business:

1. <u>Annual Meeting</u>, Part 2, Jan. 22nd – Agenda

3. Installation of New Council Members

At our Annual Congregational Meeting, Part 1, the following persons were elected to Church Council: Fred Oestreicher (2nd term), Bob Wolff (2nd term), Sharon Marks, and Greg Paterno.

Since our first Council meeting in 2023 is January 9, they should be installed during worship on January 1 or January 8. They agreed to being installed on January 8.



4. <u>Requested CPR class dates</u>

Nation's Best CPR has requested CPR class dates at St. Matthias in March and April, as well as an additional class in January. Council reviewed the dates and did not see any scheduling conflicts. Pastor Paul will notify Nation's Best CPR that the dates have been approved.

5. Office Purchasing

Council discussed obtaining a Church credit card with a specific spending limit to aid our church secretary Amy and our organist/choir director Chuck in their purchasing church related items (i.e. stamps, music supplies, office supplies, etc.). These purchases would be made online as well as in-store (post office, Staples, etc.). Council felt that a \$500 credit limit would be appropriate, which could be increased, if needed. A log book would be used for 2 purposes: a log in/out page for when someone needs to take the card off premises, and a log for indicating the date, merchant, and amount of each purchase, as well as a folder to hold the corresponding receipts. Council agreed to move forward in obtaining a Church credit card with a beginning credit limit of \$500.

The <u>January and February</u> Worship Assistants and Calendar were reviewed. A few small updates were needed, and we'll contact our secretary Amy with those updates. The next monthly Council meeting will be on <u>Monday, January 9, at 7pm</u>. We'll meet via Zoom call again. Fred Oestreicher will lead devotions for the January Council meeting. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Motion seconded by Bob Wolff. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:54pm.
