Peter said to the people:
They put (Jesus) to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised Him on the third day and allowed Him to

appear, not to all the people, but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead. (Acts 10:39b-41)

After Jesus rose from the dead, why didn't He just show Himself to the religious leaders and Roman leaders of the day, and end all debate about whether He really "rose from the dead"? Why didn't Jesus go to all of His enemies and gloat about how He had won, and they had lost? And why didn't Jesus take revenge on His enemies? After all, if your enemies kill you, and then you're able to rise from the dead, and can never die again, why not take a victory lap, and rub it in the faces of those who've wronged you?

If <u>I</u> were Jesus, that's probably what <u>I</u> would've done. But, fortunately for us, I'm <u>not</u> Jesus. Jesus is God Himself. And when Jesus went to the cross, He wasn't interested in revenge or "rubbing it in" to His enemies. Jesus went to the cross to <u>save us</u>, and <u>the whole world</u> (in fact, the Greek word is "cosmos", which means "<u>universe</u>") <u>from our sin</u>. Even though we don't deserve it, and haven't earned it. That's what <u>grace</u> is... an unearned, undeserved gift from God.

Jesus doesn't go to the cross and rise from the tomb for revenge, gloating, or personal accolades. Jesus went to the cross, and rose from the dead, in order to save you. And me. And everyone... including all those people we really don't like! Because God's love goes beyond human understanding. And nothing can stop God's love... not even death. Thanks be to God. Amen.






Blessing of Fields and Gardens & St. Matthias Community Garden - June 5th

St. Matthias Lutheran Church Council Minutes – 3/14/2022

The March 2022 Council meeting was held via a Zoom Conference call. Voting Council members Fred Oestreicher, Bob Wolff, Ryan Winslow, and Pastor Paul were in attendance. Lisa Pegg and Norb Georges were unable to attend. Our Treasurer, Eldora Crist, was able to attend. Our Financial Secretary, Eliot Moore, was able to attend. Fred Oestreicher led the devotions at 7:00pm Council President Fred Oestreicher Called the meeting to Order at 7:05pm. Pastor Paul requested to add a new line item under "New Business" for "CPR class requests". Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the Council agenda, as amended. Motion seconded by Bob Wolff. Motion carried. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the minutes from the February 14 Council meeting, as presented. Motion seconded by Bob Wolff. Motion carried. Eldora Crist, Treasurer, presented the February Treasurer's report. Council was alerted to a message from our secretary Amy regarding some funds deposited from Thrivent that weren't communicated via email. Fred Oestreicher made a motion to accept the February Treasurer's report. Motion seconded by Ryan Winslow. Motion carried.

Pastor Paul presented his report for <u>February</u>. He attended meetings for: the monthly Synod meeting for Pastors and Deacons, Synod Zoom meeting for the Resource Center Advisory Board, and our local cluster Pastor's meeting to plan for the Easter Vigil, which will be held at Harrold Zion Lutheran Church on April 16, and Pastor Paul will be delivering the sermon. He presided at a funeral for a non-member on March 10. He made nursing home visits to Lillian Reno and Virginia Turner. He's also leading Holden Evening Prayer worship and our Adult Bible Study on Wednesday nights in Lent. Pastor Paul continues to serve as Interim Pastor at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Greensburg for approximately 5 hours per week.
