(1 Cor 12:4-7) Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are

varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

When we hear these words from St. Paul, and we think about the "gifts" that God has given us, we often think of those things that we do "well": maybe you're good at baking, sewing, teaching, mathematics, construction, painting, the list goes on. And when we offer those gifts to others, we often think of doing "what we do well" (I'm good at baking, I'll make them an apple pie).

Unfortunately, we forget that God wants us to you <u>all</u> of the gifts He's given us, <u>not</u> just the ones that we think we do "well". In your opinion, what is it that you <u>don't</u> do very well? God may be calling you to use <u>those</u> gifts in service to others. The question is... are we willing to use <u>those</u> gifts to help others, even if it means we might feel embarrassed, selfconscious, or worried about how others perceive us? Are we willing to show <u>our love for God</u> and <u>our love for our neighbors</u> in selfless, even humiliating ways?

When Jesus shared the Last Supper with His disciples, He insisted that He wash His disciples' feet: something that was considered one of the lowest and most demeaning of tasks in their day. (John 13:34-35) And Jesus said to them: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

God calls us to love one another with <u>all</u> of the gifts He's given us, and <u>not</u> just the ones that we feel like

we do "well". If you're a terrible baker, <u>bake</u> the cookies anyway. If you're not sure you have enough, <u>give</u> what you have anyway. If you're not good at writing eloquently, <u>write</u> the letter of encouragement anyway. The most impactful and loving things you may do for others may be by doing things that <u>you</u> feel are subpar or not your best effort. But to others, they might become the most treasured blessings of all, because they know you gave them out of love for God, and love for them, even when it was something that you're not comfortable doing. And it's for that blessing, that I say to you: Thanks be to God. Amen.
